



Speech Language Pathologist, FSCD Services - Casual

The Organization: GRIT is a dynamic program whose mission is to build on the skills, knowledge, and confidence of families and educators to ensure that children are supported in inclusive settings and meaningfully participate in everyday routines.

Position status: The Speech Language Pathologist (SLP) position is a 12-month casual position with fluctuating hours, up to 10 hours per week supporting families throughout the year. Hours are primarily working in the afternoon and evenings to support family engagement.

Compensation: \$42.52-\$56.49 per hour. Wage will commensurate with education and experience.

The Opportunity: Reporting to the ECS/FSCD Services Manager and in collaboration with the Specialized Services multidisciplinary team and Early Childhood Team (PUF), the Speech Language Pathologist will apply a streamlined evidence-informed approach to support the delivery of services to children/families across settings; utilizing coaching practices in natural environments to build individual and family capacity to accomplish child/family outcomes.

Key Responsibilities:

- Utilizes discipline specific evidence-based (assessment, intervention, and evaluation) practices.
- Provides team consultation and coaching within discipline specific scope of practice.
- Caregiver coaching and family capacity building in home, school and community environments
- Manage a caseload and complete administrative tasks such as consultation notes, service plans and reports.
- Administer and implement standardized paediatric occupational therapy assessments.
- Must be flexible, adaptable, and maintain a high level of professionalism at all times.
- Participate in training, program development, and team meetings as needed.

Requirements:

- Education: Master's Degree in Speech and Language Pathology & Audiologists
- Registered with ACSLPA (Practice Permit) is mandatory; continuing professional development as per ACSLPA guidelines
- Current professional liability insurance
- Minimum of five years' experience in pediatric Speech Pathology, specific evidence-based practice (assessment, intervention, and evaluation) experience.
- Passion and commitment for working with children and their families
- Demonstrated Early Childhood Learning and Development knowledge
- Demonstrated ability to work independently and effectively as part of a multidisciplinary team
- Confidence in the use of technology to support work
- Own vehicle and required insurance coverage
