Key Responsibilities:

- Utilizes discipline specific evidence-based (assessment, intervention, and evaluation) practices
- Provides team consultation and coaching within discipline specific scope of practice
- Caregiver coaching and family capacity building in home, school and community environments
- Manage a caseload and administrative tasks such as consultation notes, service plans and reports
- Coaching to staff to provide excellent care in line with the Behaviour Support Plan
- Administer and implement standardized paediatric occupational therapy assessments
- Must be flexible, adaptable, and maintain a high level of professionalism at all times
- Participate in training, program development, and team meetings as needed
